## **CARAT 2011**

### **Executive Summary:**



CARAT is a series of bilateral exercises between navies, and it is held once a year in Southeast Asia. During CARAT 2011, Navy League Siam was pleased to present concerts from Thai and US military bands and to get involved in one COMSERVE project at a local Thai school. A special thanks goes out to the Director of CARAT 2011, Rear Admiral Chaiyot Sundaranaga, and his Chief of Staff - 2nd Frigate Squadron, Captain Kosit Cheamsuphakit. They both made sure that the Royal Thai Marine band and the Unites States 7th Fleet Band, "Orient Express", were able to perform public concerts. Having support from the Royal Thai Navy and United States Navy made a tremendous

difference for the spectators, since songs were played in both Thai and English. During the Navy League reception on Friday the 13th, officers from all ships involved in CARAT 2011 were invited. Navy League Siam adopted the HTMS NARESUAN and recognized her Sailor of the 2nd quarter and the Blue Jacket of the 2nd quarter. Likewise, similar honors were presented for USS TORTUGA.

#### Reception:

On May 13<sup>th</sup>, a reception was hosted at Dicey Reily's Pub at the Marriot Resort & Spa in Pattaya, Thailand. Many sailors from the Navy League Siam Council's adopted ships, USS TORTUGA (LSD-46) and HTMS NARESUAN, were in attendance. It was also a pleasure to host sailors from the USS REUBEN JAMES (FFG-57) and USS HOWARD (DDG-83). The first order of business at the reception was to officially recognize the adoption of the Royal Thai Navy ship, HTMS NARESUAN, from Frigate Squadron 2. Navy League Siam presented Captain Boriboon Emtip a Navy League plaque in exchange for the plaque from his ship. Navy League Siam recognized the Sailor of the



Second Quarter, Saksan Wongsim, and the Blue Jacket of the Second Quarter, Pornchai Trirat.

The guests of honor from the Royal Thai Navy at this event were Rear Admiral Chaiyot Sundaranaga, Commander Frigate Squadron 2, and his Chief of Staff, Captain Kosit. This was a very unique opportunity for a Navy League council to adopt a host country's ship.

The Junior Sailor of the Second Quarter and Blue Jacket of the Second Quarter onboard the USS TORTUGA were also recognized. Plaques and coins were presented to the ship's skipper, Commander Adrian Ragland. The skippers of the USS HOWARD and USS REUBEN JAMES also received plaques and 3-baht customized stamps from the President of Navy League Siam Council, Peter Thorand. The last concert between both the Thai and US bands was at Darasamatur School in Sriracha. The day started off with a workshop for the music students at the school. During the performance, the RTM Band started first and excited the crowd with renditions of popular Thai songs. The 3,000 students in attendance were very excited. Afterwards, the 7th Fleet Band, The Orient Express, came on stage and did their set, which included a Michael Jackson song. The applause drowned out the band for a few minutes and an enjoyable time was had by everybody.
